<u>Bundesbehindertengleichstellungsgesetz</u>: Regulation (EC) No. 1107/2006 on the "Rights of persons with disabilities and persons with reduced mobility when travelling by air" aims to give people with disabilities and persons with reduced mobility the same opportunities to travel by air as everyone else. Equal treatment of persons with reduced mobility applies, which means that the regulation prohibits air carriers and tour operators from refusing to book and transport passengers on the basis of disability or reduced mobility when flying from an airport in the territory of an EU Member State. A derogation from this is possible if there are special safety reasons.

# Legislation in place regulating built environment accessibility conditions in railway infrastructures

YES – based on the regulations established by PRM TSI NIP (TSI 1300/2014) and the European series of standards EN 16584, EN 16585, EN 16586 and EN 16587

#### Additional information:

The most important national legal basis for the railway mode of transport is the "Federal Act on Railways, Rail Vehicles on Railways and Transport on Railways (Railway Act 1957 - EisbG)".

In accordance with Section 42 of the Federal Act on Railways, <u>ÖBB-Infrastruktur AG</u> must draw up a six-year framework plan, which forms the basis for the planned investments in the rail infrastructure, taking into account the specifications of the 2025+ target network. According to the implementation plan, all railway stations and stops with more than 1,000 travellers per day should be barrier-free by 2025.

  of passengers travelling by rail. It also regulates assistance for people with disabilities and people
  with reduced mobility.

Chapter III of this Regulation contains the rights of persons with disabilities and persons with reduced mobility. |
