It was prepared with the participation of several experts from various fields in order to ensure the interconnection and compatibility of all measures and tasks. NO Additional information: The Slovak National Centre for Human Rights (the Centre) is a national human rights institution established in the Slovak Republic. The Centre performs a wide range of tasks in the area of human rights and fundamental freedoms including the rights of the child and observance of the principle of equal treatment. The Centre among other powers: • monitors and evaluates the observance of human rights and the observance of the equal treatment principle; • conducts research and surveys to provide data in the area of human rights; gathers and distributes information in this area; • prepares educational activities and participating in information campaigns aimed at increasing tolerance of the society; • provides legal assistance to victims of discrimination and manifestations of intolerance; • issues expert opinions on matters of the observance of the equal treatment principle; • performs independent inquiries related to discrimination; • prepares and publishes reports and recommendations on issues related to discrimination; and • provides library services and services in the área.
Public Body that manages complaint about accessibility in place	YES Additional information: The Office of the Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities (Úrad Komisára pre osoby so zdravotným postihnutím in Slovak) is a Slovakian state institution overseeing the protection of the rights of persons





with disabilities. The Office was established by law in parallel with the Office of the Commissioner for
Children, with a view to assure the protection of the rights of persons with disabilities in the broadest
sense, in accordance with the provisions of the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities
(CRPD) and its Optional Protocol.
Activities:

- Examining complaints regarding violations of the rights of persons with disabilities

- Meeting persons with disabilities in places of detention or custody in private or in the presence of his/her lawyer

The umbrella organisation is the <u>Slovak Disability Forum</u> (Slovenské fórum osôb so zdravotným postihnutím in Slovak). It is federation of nationwide organisations of people with disabilities, which was established on 20 November 2003. The supreme body is the general assembly held once in 4 years. Each member organisation sends two representatives to its meeting. The highest body in the time between two general assembly meetings is the Presidency of SDC/SDF, consisting of the representatives appointed by individual member organisations. The executive body is the Executive Committee elected by the general assembly. The statutory representatives are the SDC President elected by the general assembly and the director appointed by the Executive Committee.

International accessibility standards have been incorporated into the following Slovak standards STN:

- STN EN 301549 Accessibility requirements for ICT products and services. The present document specifies the functional accessibility requirements applicable to ICT products and services, together with a description of the test procedures and evaluation methodology for each accessibility requirement in a form that is suitable for use in public procurement within Europe. The present document is intended to be used with Web based technologies, non-web technologies and hybrids that use both. It covers both software and hardware as well as services. It is intended for use by both providers and procurers, but it is expected that it will also be of use to many others as well. The relationship between the present document and the essential requirements of Directive 2016/2102 on the accessibility of the websites and mobile applications of public sector bodies is given in Annex A.

- STN EN 17210 Accessibility and usability of the built environment Functional requirements. This document describes basic, minimum functional requirements and recommendations for an accessible and usable built environment, following "Design for All"/"Universal Design" principles which will facilitate equitable and safe use for a wide range of users, including persons with disabilities. The requirements and recommendations given in this document are applicable across the full spectrum of the built environment. These functional accessibility and usability requirements and recommendations are relevant to the design, construction, refurbishment or adaptation, and maintenance of built environments including outdoor pedestrian and urban areas.
- TNI CEN/TR 17621 Accessibility and usability of the built environment Technical performance criteria and specifications: This document has been developed to support EN 17210, "Accessibility and usability of the built environment Functional requirements". This document provides and exemplifies technical performance criteria and specifications for an accessible and usable built environment, following the Design for All/Universal design principles. The document specifies what is necessary to align with these principles which will facilitate equitable and safe use for a wide range of users. The technical performance criteria and specifications are applicable across the full spectrum of the built environment and can be used as criteria for awarding public contracts (in support of the Public Procurement Directives). These technical performance criteria and specifications are specifically applicable to the design, construction, refurbishment or adaptation, and maintenance of public or public-use environments including external areas.
- TNI CEN/TR 17622 Accessibility and usability of the built environment Conformity assessment: This document provides criteria to assess conformity of the built environment with the functional requirements and recommendations described in EN 17210 Accessibility and usability of the built environment Functional requirements, regardless of whether self-declaration, second-party attestation or third-party certification is requested. This document provides guidance on how and when accessibility and usability of the built environment have to be considered throughout all stages of the building process, including feasibility, design, construction, completion and post occupancy. It is also applicable for refurbishment or adaptation of existing buildings. FprCEN/TR 17621 Accessibility and usability of the built environment Technical performance criteria and





- specifications, provides examples of a way or ways in which the functional requirements in EN 17210 could be fulfilled.
- STN EN ISO 21801-1 Cognitive accessibility Part 1: General guidelines (ISO 21801-1:2020): This document presents guidelines for the design and development of cognitively accessible systems, including products and services and built environments. This document is relevant to mainstream systems as well as those designed specifically for people with disability. Within the broad field of accessibility, this document is limited to guidance related to cognitive accessibility. NOTE 1 It acknowledges, however, that diverse sensory perceptions can impact cognitive accessibility. NOTE 2 While the following guidance in this document can benefit all users, it is included here because failure to follow it could lead to barriers that would prevent some potential users from being able to use the system at all. This document is relevant to all types of systems.
- <u>STN EN ISO 21801-2 Cognitive accessibility Part 2: Reporting (ISO 21801-2:2022)</u>: This document specifies requirements for reporting the cognitive accessibility of systems, including assistive products, assistive technologies, consumer technologies, and household appliances, according to the recommendations given in ISO 21801-1:2020.
- TNI CEN/TR 17884 ICT accessibility competences Guidelines for a more inclusive ICT development: This document specifies the knowledges, skills, responsibility and autonomy of ICT experts involved in the development of products and services (including digital contents) to increase the accessibility knowledge in different fields, for different competences and responsibilities. This document: considers accessibility as "base line" (accessibility has been also recognized in EN 16234-1:2019 as a Transversal aspect); recognizes accessibility as the requirement in procurement for both public and private sectors; provides an overview of useful CEN, ISO and ESCO publications in the field; defines a set of knowledges, skills, responsibility and autonomy for different ICT areas to improve accessibility in the current professional roles and job positions (hardware, software, web); refers to ESCO ICT profiles, that can be adapted for the three main areas: hardware, software, web; refers to W3C activities for define knowledges, skills, responsibility and autonomy in web accessibility role profiles.

One of them is CEDA (Centre of Design for All) at the Faculty of Architecture and Design, Slovak University of Technology in Bratislava.
Mandatory requirement regarding accessibility courses at post-secondary level in place	Additional information: There is no mandatory requirement in Slovakia. There are some schools/universities that provide courses on Accessibility/ Universal Design/ Inclusive Design/Barrier-free design/ Design-for-All. One of them is the Faculty of Architecture and Design, Slovak University of Technology in Bratislava, which provides mandatory course on Universal Design for bachelor students in the architecture and urban planning study programs.

	The basic requirements of accessibility of the built environment were governed until recently by the Construction Act No. 50/1976, which lays down the general requirements for designing constructions including the requirements for accessibility. This law was valid until 31 March 2023, after which it was replaced by the Construction Act No. 201/2022 and the Spatial Planning Act No. 200/2022.





	The more specific technical requirements for accessibility are governed by the Decree No. 532/2002 Coll. on General Technical Requirements for Construction and Buildings Used by Persons with Limited Mobility and Orientation . This Decree is applicable to new constructions as well as to renovations and restorations. This decree is valid until 31 March 2023, after which it will be replaced by new decree.
