#### **Additional information:**

The implementation of the National Strategy for Persons with Disabilities 2021-2030 is planned by two-year action plans for Implementation of the National Strategy for Persons with Disabilities. Each two-year plan has certain components: measures/ activities, budget, target month/ year for implementation, expected results, indicators, responsible institutions (leader, partners).

According to the approved <u>Action Plan for the period 2023-2024 for the implementation of the National Strategy for People with Disabilities 2021-2030</u>, Bulgaria is in the process of harmonizing national regulations with the accessibility requirements of European regulations, directives and standards that have entered into force with a term of 2023-2024.

The Action Plan for the Implementation of the Final Recommendations to the Republic of Bulgaria Addressed by the UN Committee on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (2021-2026) contains information about timing to implement recommendations.

According to the report <u>"Key indicators for social inclusion and fundamental rights in Bulgaria - Applying data to the policy process"</u>, the indicators for monitoring at the action plans are not based on research, but either report a specific activity as completed or not completed (e.g. action plan developed, compliance table completed, etc.) or report specific numbers (participants in training, buildings renovated to ensure accessibility, etc.). The report is prepared by the National Statistical Institute (NSI) and the Agency of European Union for Fundamental Rights (FRA).

# accessibility courses at post-secondary level in place

There is no mandatory requirement for courses on accessibility in the Bulgarian universities/schools of architecture/ engineering/ design.

Two good examples of related initiatives:

- In the University of Architecture, Civil Engineering and Geodesy (UACEG) there is an Elective discipline PHYSICAL AND SENSORY ACCESSIBLE ENVIRONMENT.
- In the <u>Masters' Programmes at the New Bulgarian University</u>, the teaching program in Architecture considers acquiring competences by the students in creating accessible environment for people with disabilities.

# Legislation requiring public buildings to be accessible in place

#### **Additional information:**

Regulation No. RD-02-20-2 of 26.01.2021 determines the accessibility and universal design requirements of the elements of the accessible environment in the urbanization territory and the buildings and facilities. The Regulation is implemented and monitored by the Ministry of Regional Development and Public Works.

The <u>collection of standards "Standards for accessibility and usability of the built environment"</u> was created in order to be used as a tool to support the implementation of Regulation No. RD-02-20-2.

The collection includes the following standards and standardization documents:

• БДС EN 17210:2021 Accessibility and usability of the built environment. Functional Requirements - describes basic, minimum functional requirements and recommendations for an accessible and usable built environment, following the principles of "Design for All"/"Universal Design", which will
