	Regarding accessible products, the Technical and Test Institute for Construction assesses a very limited number of products (handrails, shower seats, lifting devices/ mobile and stationary jacks, paving stones with special tactile treatment, command system for activating acoustic orientation and information elements for the visually impaired). This certification body has been entrusted by the Office for Technical Standardization, Metrology and State Testing with the coordination of authorized persons/notified bodies/ subjects for technical assessment in the field of conformity assessment of construction products. Certification of accessibility is not carried out according to European standards; so-called technical guides for product conformity assessment are issued and followed.
