However, the National Resilience and Recovery Plan has established that, by 30th June 2024, the Ministry of Disabilities will issue a new 'Framework Law on Disability'. This process started with the issuing of Law 227/2021 establishing the 'upgrading of public services in terms of inclusion and accessibility' as a key area that will be disciplined by the new Framework Law.

applications in place	The Italian entity in charge of monitoring is Agenzia per l'Italia Digitale (AGID), which monitors that public administrations (PAs) comply with standards and procedures on accessibility of ICT tools according to Italian law and EU Directive 2016/ 2102.
	The AGID makes sure that PAs release by 23 rd September each year an "Accessibility Declaration" concerning any ICT tools under their control (websites, mobile apps etc). Furthermore, PAs have to publish by 31 st March annually their "Accessibility Objectives". The AGID also released the "Guidelines on





	 accessibility of ICT tools' which all PAs must adhere to in order to declare their ICT tools' accessibility standards. Based on these elements, the AGID collects information and results achieved. Additional link: Member States' bodies in charge of monitoring the Web Accessibility Directive
